Dear Stephanie,

This week we wrapped up 4 days of sessions in the Illinois House, which was another great opportunity to pass legislation to help our citizens. The next few weeks will be busy as we aim to get as much done as possible before the scheduled adjournment of the House on April 8. There is much to be accomplished in our remaining days, but I am optimistic we can pass meaningful bills that will have a positive impact on the lives of many. One bill that I would like to highlight is House Bill 4306 (<u>HB 4306</u>,) of which I am the House sponsor.

The purpose is to provide better mental health care to foster kids in Illinois. Imagine the stress and trauma on a child when they are removed from their home and placed into a new environment. The effects are many, often including significant mental health issues. This bill would require a mental health care provider to be assigned to all youth in DCFS care within 30 days after removal from his or her home. With over 23,000 children in Illinois in the foster care system, it's important to ensure that all of these children have access to professionals and resources that will help assist in dealing with traumatic and trying circumstances. Under this legislation follow up visits and well being checks will continue until the youth is no long under the care of the department. I'm happy that the bill has advanced to the Senate and I'm looking forward to seeing it passed and sent to the Governor's Desk to be signed into law.

I will continue to update all of you on important legislation and events as we continue our work in session.

Finally, I have listed some of the many new district updates and events taking place. I'm also excited to see our senior Kane County meal drive return with even more dates taking place than in previous years! 



Preparing for Spring Weather

With spring just around the corner, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) kicked off Severe Weather Preparedness Month by partnering with the National Weather Service (NWS) to publish a <u>Severe Weather Preparedness Guide</u> to help prepare Illinoisans for any severe weather.

Additionally, Illinois residents are strongly encouraged to have a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) All Hazards Weather Radio with battery backup. These radios can be programmed to receive alerts for specified counties to help keep you and your family safe during severe weather conditions.

Another resource to be aware of during Severe Weather Preparedness Month is the <u>free</u> <u>mobile app</u> developed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). This app provides notifications and updated information about severe weather while you are on the go. These tools are critical to protect you and your family as severe weather frequently strikes during the night while we are sleeping.




Facebook Live Mondays at 9 AM
