I have been re-appointed to be a member of the Budget Working Group and I will work towards a truly balanced budget for the third year in a row and continue to improve the state's finances.

Make sure you get vaccinated and get your booster shot! With the Omicron Variant, it's also important to continue masking up, keeping your distance, and staying healthy overall. Unloading: These sites are staffed, so you will have assistance unloading your equipment.


Data Security: All data on computer hard drives, printers, and cell phones will be completely destroyed (meeting all FACTA privacy protection requirements)

Holiday Closures: Drop-off sites are closed on most public holidays, but not all. Please check online for the current list of holiday closures.

#### COST FOR TVS AND MONITORS

- \$25 (for screens under 21° measured diagonally) or
- \$35 (for screens 21" and over).
- Pay onsite with CASH or CARD, or online with card and bring a printed receipt.





#### ITEMS ACCEPTED AT KANE COUNTY RECYCLING CENTERS:

All items are FREE to drop off (except for TVs and Monitors, which do have a cost as outlined above).

Electronics: TVs\*, Computers, Monitors\*, Laptops, Phones, Cords, Cables, Servers, Printers, Scanners, Keyboards, Stereos, Speakers, Battery backups, Gaming consoles, Power tools, Holiday lights, and more.

\*See "Costs" above for TVs and monitors.

**Books:** Hard cover or paperback books of any age, in any condition, for reuse or recycling.

Paper: Magazines, periodicals, brochures, office paper, newspaper, packing paper.

Clothing & Shoes: Clothing items of any kind. Paired shoes of any kind. Accessories, like hats, purses, belts, scarves. Textiles, like sheets, towels, curtains, blankets. These items can be in any condition, even if worn or torn, as long as they are clean. All will be reused or recycled.

Scrap Metal: Anything made of metal, like lawn furniture, BBQs, fire pits, pots and pans, hot water tanks, hardware, metal fencing, bed frames.

Cardboard: Corrugated cardboard (flattened).

Shredded Paper: Shredded paper (in paper bags, stapled shut).

Appliances: Household appliances, like washers, dryers, toasters, blenders, vacuums. We do not take freon-containing devices like refrigerators or air-conditioners.

Note: The Elburn location only accepts electronics.

# **Drivers License and ID Card Expiration Dates Extended Until March 31st, 2022**

Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White announced that the expiration dates for driver's licenses and ID Cards have been extended an additional three months from Jan. 1, 2022 to March 31, 2022. This extension does not apply to commercial driver's licenses (CDL) and CDL learner's permits. This will be the final extension.

# **Energy Assistance for Winter Applications Open until May 31st 2022**

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity and the Citizens Utility Board are reminding residents to apply for \$200 million remaining in utility assistance under Gov. JB Pritzker's Help Illinois Families initiative, an expansion of the Low-Income Household Energy Assistance Program under the American Rescue Plan.

Designed to support Illinois' most vulnerable families, the program will help cover the cost of heating and energy bills, including expanded benefits provided this year from \$750 to \$1,000, on average per household. Last day to apply **online** with the Request for Services form is **April 15.** After that date you can still apply through your local administering agency through May 31 2022.






# LIHWAP Applications Open Until August 31, 2023


